WHO IS JESUS?

A Bible Study for the Newly Saved

You have had an encounter with Jesus. You asked him to be the Lord of your life. You believed in Him for salvation from sin. But, who is this Jesus and how is it that He can save you from your sin? Let's see what the Bible has to say about it.

If you have a Bible, take the time to look up each Scripture. This is important so that you can see the parts before and after the passage that help determine its meaning. If you don't have a Bible, verses are printed in the right column so that you can still answer the questions. The left column lists additional Scripture references that apply to the topic being discussed. Look those up if you want more information. Scriptures provided are from the New International Version (NIV).

Always pray before reading the Word, ask God to show you things about Himself and about yourself.

Here is a valuable Bible study instruction: whenever you read a passage, ask who, what, when, where, why, and how questions about what you are reading. For example, read John 1:1-2 and John 1:14. List everything you learn about "the Word" from this passage. Look for answers to who the word is, what it is and what it did, where the word was and where it came from, and look for anything that answers when.

Did you see that the term "Word" in these verses refers to Jesus? In verse 14, it says, "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us." Jesus is the one who became a man with flesh and lived among men on earth. Read the verses again, this time substituting Jesus' name everywhere it says "Word."

Another important Bible study tool is called cross-referencing. When you discover a truth in the Bible, check other verses to see if they confirm the truth. Cross-referencing, or comparing other verses in Scripture, also helps bring understanding to a verse that is confusing or not completely clear.

Cross-referencing Colossians 1:15-19 confirms what we saw in John 1 and gives additional details about who Jesus is. Look closely at each verse and list what you learn. (I know some of these words are difficult to understand. Ask the Holy Spirit to expand your understanding and to be your teacher.)
