IS ANYBODY HUNGRY? A Bible Study for the Newly Saved

Man's body needs food and water to live, so does the spiritual part of you. What is the food and water that your spirit needs? In Matthew 4:4, Jesus said man shall not live by bread alone but by every *word* that comes from the mouth of God. Ephesians 5:26 speaks of the "water of the *word*." The Bible is God's word; it is food and water to you. You need it to be healthy in your new life with God. Let's spend some time exploring what makes the Bible so important to you.

If you have a Bible, take the time to look up each Scripture. This is important so that you can see the parts before and after the passage that help determine its meaning. If you don't have a Bible, verses are printed in the right column so that you can still answer the questions. If there is not room to write your answers on this sheet, use a separate piece of paper. The left column lists additional Scripture references that apply to the topic being discussed. Look those up if you want more information. Scriptures provided are from the New International Version (NIV).

Always pray before reading the Word, ask God to show you things about Himself and yourself.

	 What is He working in you? "To will" means the <u>desire</u> to act according to what pleases God. "To act" means the <u>ability</u> to actually do what pleases God.
